Heidi joined the SMDNC as Co-Historian in early 2018, coming up to speed quickly to help with the increased volume of applicants who had an interest in becoming members in time for the 400<sup>th</sup> year anniversary of the Mayflower's landing. We wish Heidi much success in her future endeavors. Thank-you, Heidi-you will be missed!

### **Karina Stephenson, Co-Historian**

Karina Stephenson is originally from New England and moved to North Carolina ten years ago. Karina and her husband, having raised their family and putting regular work schedules behind them, are enjoying traveling more, and, finally, Karina is enjoying the extra time to explore her interests in genealogy and history.

After doing an excellent job establishing a new Mayflower family lineage, SMDNC Historian Cheryl Vislay, presented Karina with an opportunity to be mentored to become a Historian with the SMDNC. Karina enjoys learning and helping others with their applications and in their journey to prove lines to their Mayflower ancestors. Karina is a proven descendant of Isaac Allerton and Richard Warren, and is continuing the process of verifying additional Mayflower ancestors. She is also a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, and she assists members in completing supplemental applications in her home DAR Chapter.

### **Lynn Pritchard, Co-Historian**

Lynn grew up in southwestern Ontario and now lives in Warren County, North Carolina with her husband, Fred. She graduated with a BSc (Hons) from Queen's University at Kingston Ontario and later obtained her PhD in Physiology from the College of Medicine, Penn State in Hershey, Pennsylvania. After spending her career working in regulatory affairs, involved in the development of new medicines, she retired from the pharmaceutical industry a few years ago. Lynn then started her own regulatory affairs consulting business and currently is working part time. She also holds a Class C-Well Operators License with the State of North Carolina and helps look after her neighborhood drinking water well system.

Her hobbies include genealogy, traveling, kayaking, walking, choral music, reading and sourdough. Lynn has been a member of the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of North Carolina since 2017, and is a descendant of Elder William and Mary Brewster. She enjoys helping cousins with their Mayflower stories.

### **Warren Becket Soule, Co-Historian**

Warren Becket Soule (who usually goes by his middle name, Becket) graduated from Davidson College, and has received degrees from the Episcopal Divinity School, the University of Dallas, and Harvard University, as well as the professional Certificate in Genealogical Research from Boston University.

Becket has taught at The Catholic University of America, the Dominican House of Studies (Washington, DC), the Pontifical College Josephinum (Columbus, OH), and Oxford University, and currently serves as Emeritus Professor of Canon Law at Saint Paul University in Ottawa, Ontario (Canada). He has been visiting lecturer and fellow at other institutions of higher studies in the United States, Great Britain, and the Ukraine, and served as an official for the Congregation for the Eastern Churches in Vatican City; Becket has also served as pastor of parishes in Hanover, New Hampshire and Waynesville, North Carolina. He has recently returned to North Carolina, and now serves as pastor of Saint Margaret of Scotland Catholic Church in Maggie Valley, North Carolina.

Proud of his *Mayflower* heritage, Becket is descended from several passengers of that famous voyage (Isaac Allerton, John Alden, William Bradford, Francis Eaton, Samuel Fuller, Edward Fuller, John Howland, George Soule, and Richard Warren, as well as Philip Delano of the *Fortune* [1621]), and is a member of the Canadian Society of Mayflower

Descendants and the Society of Mayflower Descendants in North Carolina, as well as the Society of Colonial Wars and the United Empire Loyalist Association in Canada. He looks forward to assisting applicants in completing their applications, particularly his Soule cousins.

Beginning in the 1970s, the General Society of Mayflower Descendants sponsored the publication of a series of books originally called the "Five Generation Project," which sought to document all of the passengers' descendants for the first five generations. They soon became known as the "**Silver Books**" (because of the color of the cover), and are an invaluable tool because of the meticulous research and documentation they contain. The more recent books have expanded to contain six generations, naming the seventh, and thus frequently reach into the early nineteenth century. One of the earliest volumes to appear (vol. 3 [1981]) was the descendants of George Soule. While it was a painstaking operation, it suffered from the change in genealogical standards that was occurring at just about that time; it very quickly became clear that this book was not adequate to substantiate the identities and families of George Soule's descendants. In the 1990s, Louise Walsh Throop began documenting the lines with substantial further research, and published several soft cover volumes officially called *Mayflower Families in Progress* (MFIP), but more colloquially known as "Pink Books" because their covers are the hue of the "may flower." **Soule Kindred in America** proposed a revision and completion of the pink books with the goal of producing a final silver book, and Becket serves as a researcher and editor of this series of volumes.

### **Cheryl Vislay, Co-Historian**

Cheryl Vislay grew up in Queens and Long Island, N.Y. and moved to Charlotte, N.C. more than twenty-five years ago. She currently lives in Mint Hill, NC with her husband Stephen and 16-year-old son Sean. She graduated from Queens College (City University of New York) with a B.A. in Art and attended Baruch College (City University of New York) for graduate studies.

With the encouragement of Jean Slater, a former SMDNC Governor, Cheryl became Co-Historian with Frank Horton (long time historian for the North Carolina Society) as her mentor in 2014. Cheryl is a proven descendant of Richard Warren (X2), Peter Brown, Thomas Rogers, Edward Doty, John Alden and Priscilla Mullins. Besides being a member of the SMDNC, Cheryl is also a member of Daughters of the American Revolution and the Winthrop Society. She has written articles about some of her more recent ancestors for Lighthouse Digest magazine, Rhode Island Roots (RI Genealogical Society) and the Winthrop Society Fleet News and is currently the Editor of the Beavertail Lighthouse Museum Association's Lighthouse Log where she contributes historical articles about the lighthouse and its Keepers.

Cheryl enjoys working with applicants and especially learning about their family stories and helping them with their journey in finding and proving their Mayflower Ancestry.

## Ancestor's Corner

### Ray Maxson - A Francis Cooke Descendant

I am sure that most of the Mayflower Descendants have a similar story. So now, here is good news - The Mayflower II has completed its years long building and has left its building dock and is now sailing to Plymouth Rock. I heard about the building of the Mayflower II after I went to the Tri-annual National Mayflower Meeting in 2017 in Plymouth, MA. It was being built in Mystic, R.I., and I could help build the ship if I got a Trunnel (wooden peg to pound into the ship planks to hold the planks in place). Four hundred years ago when the first Mayflower was built, it was all built of wood, nails would rust and not hold. So, I got a peg and signed it with all my descendants who were also Mayflower descendants. And as the sign says, YOUR TRUNNEL WILL LIVE ON IN MAYFLOWER II FOR MANY YEARS TO COME.



I got a great view of the Mayflower Society and all it is doing World Wide at the Convention and met a lot of cousins in the 3000 or so who attended and paraded up to our church meetings and the Mayflower library and I got a Maxson brick for the Mayflower Garden Walk. But I could not wait to see the building of the MAYFLOWER II so, I went to Mystic, RI to see the building.



## An Iconic Ship

*Mayflower II* is a reproduction of the original *Mayflower* that carried the Pilgrims to Plymouth. The ship is owned by Plimoth Plantation and currently undergoing restoration at Mystic Seaport. When the *Mayflower II* is fully restored, she will return to her home berth in Massachusetts.

The story of the Pilgrims and the *Mayflower* is deeply embedded in American culture. For the Pilgrims, the *Mayflower* represented hope for freedom, rebirth and a fresh start. The ship reminds us of the ideals to which we aspire as a nation.




